i) Name the poem and the poet.

☞ Poem: *I am like grass* (from the poem "On Killing a Tree")

ii) Why does the poet say that he is like grass?

☞ The poet says he is like grass because grass is strong and grows again even after being cut. Similarly, he shows strength and the ability to rise again.

iii) Why does the poet say that he will sprout again?

☞ The poet says this because, like grass, he believes that even if he is cut down or defeated, he will grow again and come back with new life.

4.a) For whom is life hell according to Padma's mother?

According to Padma's mother in the story "*Dharam Juddha*," life is hell for a woman whose husband is dead. She believes that a woman's identity is tied entirely to her husband, and without him, her life loses its value and becomes a burden.

b) Why did Yayati resume his old age?

In the story of "*Yayati*," the king resumed his old age because he realized that sensual desire is never satisfied by indulgence. After spending a thousand years in his son Puru's youth, he understood that desire only grows stronger with use, like fire fed by fuel. He chose to take back his old age to seek spiritual peace instead.

c) Why was the nymph embarrassed and ashamed?

This usually refers to the story of *"The Selfish Giant"* or similar fables. If this is from the story of **Echo and Narcissus**, the nymph Echo was embarrassed and ashamed because her love was rejected by Narcissus. She was so humiliated that she hid in caves and remote places until her body faded away, leaving only her voice.

d) Why did Jim say about their gifts that "they're too nice to use at present"?

In O. Henry's *"The Gift of the Magi,"* Jim says this because the couple had sold the very things the gifts were meant for. Della sold her hair to buy Jim a gold chain for his watch, but Jim had sold his watch to buy Della expensive combs for her hair. Since neither possessed the "treasure" the gifts were designed to adorn, the gifts became temporarily useless.

e) How does the poet get consolation in the poem, "On His Blindness"?

In John Milton's poem, the poet gets consolation through "Patience." Patience personified whispers to him that God does not need man's work or gifts. He realizes that those who "only stand and wait" serve God just as well as those who travel the world, as long as they bear their "mild yoke" with devotion.

f) Why does the poet ask the winter wind to blow?

In Shakespeare's song "*Blow, Blow, Thou Winter Wind*," the poet asks the wind to blow because its sting is not as sharp as human ingratitude. He suggests that even though the winter wind is cold and biting, it is more "kind" and honest than a friend who forgets a favor or a person who is ungrateful.
